ESPGHAN published its first Position Paper providing recommendations for the diagnosis, assessment, and management of juvenile polyposis syndrome in children and adolescents.

KEY POINTS

- The recommendations were developed by the ESPGHAN Polyposis Working Group with invited experts to assist clinicians and health care providers in managing patients with juvenile polyposis.
- Many recommendations are based on expert opinion after applying a modified GRADE system, reflecting that much of the published literature is descriptive or retrospective.
- The paper provides guidance on appropriate management and timing of procedures in paediatric patients with juvenile polyposis syndrome.
- The paper addresses genes BMPR1A and SMAD4, juvenile polyps, and hereditary hemorrhagic telangiectasia.
- Formation of international collaboration and consortia is proposed to monitor patients prospectively and advance understanding of juvenile polyposis conditions.
