KEY POINTS

- Learning objectives include aetiology, risk factors, classification, symptoms, diagnosis, and medical and surgical treatment concepts for anal fissures.
- The course covers pathophysiology, classification, and therapeutic options for anal abscess and anal fistula.
- Target audience includes gastroenterologists and surgeons in training, as well as other physicians, nurses, biotechnicians, and medical students with an interest in coloproctology.
