KEY POINTS

- Chronic pancreatitis is a severe fibroinflammatory disorder of the pancreas with high morbidity and mortality, rising global incidence, and poorly understood pathogenesis despite progress in identifying risk factors.
- The course addresses aetiology, epidemiology, progression, natural history, diagnosis and staging of chronic pancreatitis.
- Management topics include pain management, pancreatic exocrine insufficiency, endoscopic therapy, surgical therapy, bile duct obstruction, and pseudocysts.
- Two clinical cases are included to allow application of knowledge in real-life scenarios.
- The course is suitable for gastroenterologists in training, physicians and surgeons in other disciplines, nurses, biotechnicians, and advanced-years medical students with an interest in gastroenterology.
